Goff, the following personal property to wit, his the said Edwards' entire stock of Cattle, consisting of three in number, his entire stock of hogs, consisting of six in number, and two hinds, his entire crop of Corn, fodder, Peasants and Cotton, which shall be personal fund what so the said James Edwards has planted and cultivated in the present year, said crops to be delivered to said Edward J. Goff as early as they can be gotten ready to be sold, he Grant to secure the following debts to wit, the Note of sixty five (\$65) dollars, given February the 15th 1870, by said Edwards to St. W. Norfleet & Co. at Franklin, Va. also two Notes of sixty (\$60) dollars given the same day to said St. W. Norfleet & Co. also two Notes of sixty five (\$65) dollars, given the 1st day of September 1870, to said St. W. Norfleet & Co. the foregoing sums having been advanced to said James Edwards during the last and present years by said St. W. Norfleet & Co. for the purpose of cultivating his the said Edwards' crops. And the said James Edwards does hereby waive his right to claim the same. He doth Exemplify for the foregoing amounts of money due to said St. W. Norfleet & Co. Witness the following Signatures and Seal.
