Deft, Sheriff and Committee of James Mayhew did, and there are Defendants, it was ordered and awarded that Geo. W. Vick, who was shortly appointed a Commissioner for that purpose should proceed to sell before the Court house in Southampton County in said County and State of Virginia, the Lands of James Mayhew do, as therein described; and likewise in pursuance of the said Decree, the said Geo. W. Vick as Commissioner aforesaid proceeded to advertise the Lands aforesaid and did on the 25th day of December 1849, sell a part of said Lands to wit; a tract of four hundred and sixty two (462) half acres, adjoining the Lands of St. C. Pope and others, and occupied by Walter Mayhew, whom the same were purchased by Edward R. Story, for the sum of Twelve Hundred and twenty five dollars, which was paid and secured as required by said Decree; and whereupon a further Decree made in said Cause on the day of May 1850, it was therein done, and ordered that the said Geo. W. Vick Commissioner as aforesaid receive of the Clerk of said Court, the Book of said Edward R. Story, and deliver the same and rights to the purchaser aforesaid for said Real Estate, with special warranty in the usual form. And whereas the said George W. Vick as Commissioner aforesaid has collected of said Edward R. Story the whole amount of said purchase, this deed is given made this 19th day of September 1850, between the said George W. Vick as Commissioner as aforesaid of the one part and said Edward R. Story of the other part, Witness; That the said George W. Vick, as Commissioner as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, does grant with special warranty unto the said Edward R. Story and to his heirs and assigns forever the said tract of Land of Four Hundred and sixty two and a half acres, more or less, together with all and singular, the appurtenances belonging to the same. This Deed made this Eighth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty, between Joseph B. Crumpler and Elizabeth Crumpler his wife of the first part and Daniel Broadhead of the other part, all of the County of Southampton, West of the said County of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, the receipt of which said sum is hereby acknowledged, do grant and convey to the said Broadhead a portion of the Mountain tract supposed to contain three hundred acres, more or less, of lands, that is to say, beginning at a large ditch
