Wick, Sheriff and Committee of James Mayhew did and there are Defendants, it was ordered and decreed that Geo. W. Wick (who was shortly appointed a Commissioner for that purpose) should proceed to do before the Court house don of Southampton County in said Court day in the same above named, the Land of James Mayhew do as therein directed; and whereas in pursuance of the said Decree, the said Geo. W. Wick as Commissioner aforesaid proceeded to advertise the Land aforesaid and did on the 1st of December 1849, sell a part of said Land to wit; a tract of four hundred and sixty two (462) half acres, adjoining the Land of St. C. Pope and others, and occupied by Walter Mayhew, whom the same was purchased by Edward R. Story, for the sum of Twelve Hundred and twenty five dollars, which was paid and secured as required by said Decree; and whereas a further Decree made in said Cause on the day of May 1850, it was therein directed and ordered that the said Geo. W. Wick Commissioner as aforesaid receive of the said Decree, the Debt of said Edward R. Story, and collect the same and report to the purchase of said Decree Estate, with special warranty in the usual form. And whereas the said George W. Wick as Commissioner aforesaid has collected of said Edward R. Story the whole amount of said purchase, this Debt is paid made this said above said Decree made this 19th day of September 1850, between the said George W. Wick as Commissioner as aforesaid of the one part and said Edward R. Story of the other part, Witness; That the said George W. Wick, as Commissioner as aforesaid, in consideration of the foregoing, does grant with special warranty unto the said Edward R. Story and to his heirs and assigns forever the said tract of Land of Four Hundred and sixty two and a half acres, more or less, together with all and singular, the appurtenances belonging to the same.
