

This Indenture made the 15th day of August in the year of Edward King Edward, and Henry, before Robert Bales, Esquire, Justice, William Bales, Esquire, William Willing of Elghe his wife, of the County of Northampton, Shire of Virginia, parties of the first part, and Samuel Bales of the aforesaid County and State of the second part, Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of five thousand dollars, lawfull money of the U. S. States, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, sold, sold, quit claimed, and by these presents do renew, amend and quit claim unto the said party of the second part not to have been in any former, or that certain form or form of land lying and being situate in the County County of Northampton, Shire of Virginia, and divided as follows, all that part of the tract of Land formerly belonging to the Willings of our former State, lying West of the line beginning at the said Oak and Pine, thence S. 13th W. 22.52 chains (of a pole) to a line thence East 92 rods to a certain white stump, beginning by a certain bearing being 210 of an angle every, and bounded by the line of the White Oak, Cross, Goshen, of Stone, together with an acre hereunto, the boundaries, here delineated and expressed in the schedule following, or in any other appertaining, or the commanding, and in force and effect thereof, and also in the title, right, title, interest, deed and right of land, property, possession claim and demand whatsoever as and in last as in and to the said parties of the first part, if we are to the above described premises, together with the appertaining, and the said party of the second part has chosen and affixed former and of part thereof, the said parties of the first part has hereunto set their hand and seals, the day and year first above written.
