

Survey, containing by a late Survey One hundred and fifty one acres,
 & being part of the tract of Land whereon the said Edwin Haring,

 gum standing in a bush, & corner for John H. Harding in said office
 at Brack's line, thence along said Brack's line at 4° E. 113 poles to a corner
 formerly of Hickory, thence S. 87° E. 11 poles to a dead chestnut
 tree, thence at 87° E. 113 poles to a black gum at the little swamp,
 & corner for said Brack, thence along a line of marked trees at the
 West side of the swamp, formerly thence at 87° E. 113 poles to
 a black gum, thence at 72° N. 12 poles to a tree thence at 67° N. 18
 poles to a line, thence at 88° E. 11 poles to a line, thence at 88° N. 18
 poles to a line, thence at 11° W. 56 poles to a Cypress, thence at
 67° E. 11 poles to the end of the swamp, thence up the end of the
 swamp to a sand spurs, across corner for said office of Brack's
 thence along this line at 88° N. 18 poles to a large Oak near
 the road, thence at 75° N. 27 poles to a line, & thence corner
 for said Haring, thence along a line of good marked trees at 72°
 to 88° poles to the creek, thence along the road to a white water
 corner that pole to the same heading to said Brack's line, thence along
 the line at 87° E. 11 poles to said Brack's line thence along the line at 87°
 E. 11 poles to a black gum in the swamp, thence down the end of the
 swamp to the beginning of the line and to the end the above described
 tract or parcel of Land and its appurtenances thence belonging
 unto the said office of Brack, this being and appears from a map
 the said Edwin Haring for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators

 a tract of Land formerly owned by Edwin Haring and at which said
