

Subj. Containing by a late Survey One hundred and fifty one acres,  
 being part of the tract of Land shown the said Edwin Harris,

 a corner for said Black, thence along a line of marked trees on the  
 West side of the Swamp, formerly thence S. 81° E. 114 poles to 9 feet  
 a black oak, thence at 97° N. 114 poles to a tree thence at 67° N. 87  
 poles to a tree, thence at 88° N. 114 poles to a tree, thence at 88° N.

 114° E. 114 poles to the end of the Swamp, thence along the end of the
