 and Benjamin Chapman, together with all the privileges and
 appurtenances thereto belonging, and the said Woodard and
 his wife do covenant with the said Willing that they and
 their heirs in fee of the above granted premises, shall have
 & right to use and enjoy the same and that they will
 warrant and defend the same wholly to the said Willing
 and his heirs against the lawful claims of all persons,
 Attest the following signatures and seal of J. Woodard and Frank E. Willing.

 she the said Anna J. Woodard, acknowledged, that the same
 to be her act and deed and declared that she had
 willingly signed, sealed and delivered to the said and

 the said J. J. Woodard also appeared before us
 in our said County, and acknowledged the writing
 set to be her act and deed given under our hands
 this 5th day of December 1870.
