to see the land of which people & lands did die before,

land agreed upon at Mapleton, Gooding Station and W. H.
Gooding, the date to be made in late January, passed in said
Deacon's hands to James Franklin B. Morris, citizen and counterfeiting
affirmed, did in the 9th day of December 1810, before the Notary
of said County, the said James Franklin B. Morris, for the sum of
Benjamin E. Morris, for the sum of \$1000, and of which the said James Franklin
in cash, and received his bill of exchange for \$500 due at ten months
hence, and returned by the Notary of said County in said case,
as payment of said sum, of which sum, it was agreed in token
that Joseph E. Morris, citizen, collect the said sum of the said
James Franklin B. Morris, and make to him a bill for the said sum
paid in the usual form of a bill of exchange, and otherwise the
said Benjamin E. Morris had paid the amount of said sum
to the said Joseph E. Morris while all along due thereon; therefore
the date of the 9th day of January 1811, below,
the said Joseph E. Morris, citizen, acknowledged before me the
said James Franklin B. Morris, citizen of the said
Westchester, that the said Joseph E. Morris, citizen, (Benjamin E.
Morris,) in consideration of the sum of money, and good
will annexed, unto the said Benjamin E. Morris,
and in his living and dying forever the said Joseph E. Morris,
is acknowledged, subject to the laws of the State of New York
