the County Court to satisfy and secure a debt due to Edward Boston and  
others, and John Barber, Trustees, or whereas the said Barber did file  
the said Land and said J. Bryant and Richard L. Bryant became the joint  
holders of said Land, And the said Land is the said Barber and said  
Edward and Richard in the Clerk's Office at New Haven, and

otherwise. The said tract is supposed to contain about 300 acres.  
Now or by and is bounded by the lands of George H. Darby,  
Abdelmawid Williams and others, lying near the Pine Grove;  
and being the same on which the said Richard L. Bryant  
now resides. Will sign the following signatures and sealing
