

This Court made the 25th day of December when Henry A. Freeman in his
 sole right and under the authority of the State of the first part and of H. Joseph's
 Clerk as Justice granted, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, &c. of
 the second part, to wit: That the said Henry A. Freeman and Justice H. Joseph
 doth grant unto the said H. Joseph, with special appearance, the
 following, to wit: a certain parcel or tract of Land lying in
 the said County of Southampton, State of Virginia, and situated as follows,
 bounded on the west by the Land of Thomas Doughty, on the East by
 the Cy pres Swamp, and Blackwater River, and fronting the Blackwater
 River, containing by calculation one hundred acres, more or less, the
 said Land being the tract of Land conveyed by Isaac Doughty and George
 his wife to Justice H. Joseph for a salary of Freeman
 which conveyance was made by Ind. dated August 15th, 1800, and admitted
 to record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, the 28th day of
 February, 1801, and during the term of the said grant from Doughty
 and wife to Justice H. Joseph was the power given to said Justice
 to be granted the said Land as he should see proper and convenient and also
 delay of the said Henry A. Freeman, and in accordance with the provisions
 of said Ind. therefore the first mentioned conveyance is made by the parties
 of the first part to the party of the second part, to have to them the
 following, to wit: one acre of land containing 10000 dollars,
 given by said Henry A. Freeman to Justice H. Joseph, dated 25th day of
 December 1800, which the following signatures and seals.

 do grant bargain and sell with general
 warranty, unto the said John Barber Jr. all of their right and title
