This Ind. made this 14th day of January 1871, between Benjamin Campbell of the
County of Southampton, State of Virginia, of the first part, and William Campbell
and Joshua Campbell the heirs of the said Benjamin Campbell of the second part,
Witnesseth that in consideration of certain land and appurtenances and two dollars paid
by said William and Joshua to said Benjamin, the said Benjamin Campbell did
grant and convey lawfully unto the said William Campbell and Joshua
Campbell, his heirs, the following tract of property, to wit, one certain parcel or
tract of land, lying on the lands of Southampton, State of Virginia, and bounded
as follows, to wit, the tract by the town of Littleton, Chester, on the North by
the land of John B. Pougham and John Pougham, on the East by the land of
John Pougham and on the South by the land of said Benjamin Campbell, it being
the land purchased by said Benjamin Campbell from W. B. Pougham, Concern-
ing in handwriting for John B. Pougham as containing of plantation two
hundred and eighty five acres, more or less, the said land and appurtenances to
the following persons, to wit, one of said Joshua Campbell of said
William and on the 14th day of January the Clerk did put in of the
fact, that the said Benjamin Campbell did hereby convey to himself the
right to manage in said manner as he may see fit the above conveyed
in this Ind. to said Joshua Campbell, until as the said Joshua shall
have attained the age of twenty two, and as the said Benjamin Campbell
did hereby agree that the said Benjamin Campbell, should convey
the said land together with all houses and improvements on the same
to said Joshua Campbell, as by the said Benjamin Campbell here certified of the said
Joshua's infancy, Witness the following signatures and seals.
