and Joseph G. Campbell a tract of land in Buckhannon County, Virginia, containing
several hundred and twenty acres more or less, and especially the land
by name of Jefferson and others, and attorney there, and also of the land
Buckhannon & the lower part of it which is the said land, and further and to
any of land to the west side of the said above and County line of
land at the south end of said Town, and whatever of said Land said
line was retained in said property to secure the payment of three
hundred dollars, paid of the purchase money of said property, and
which he since has paid the said Thomas, therefore, made the 25th
day of December 1870, between the said John A. Kelly & John B. Jenkins
as trustee of the said land, and the said Wm H. Daugherty,
and Vaughan, and Joseph G. Campbell of the other party,
Witness, that the said John A. Kelly, as trustee
as trustee, in consideration of the premises, doth remise
and release unto the parties of the second part, the property
afforementioned, and the appurtenances belonging thereto,

The Testator makes this 12th day of January 1871, before J. B. Price, of the first
part, and D. W. Price, of the second part, Witness, that I, H. H. Stoner, by
a Deed of Grant made and executed, dated on the 11th day of February
1869, did grant and convey to the said J. B. Price (Constituted) & Co., a tract of
land situated in Buckhannon County containing about 200 acres, and bounded
by the Land of E. C. Miller, Anthony House, William Brown and Mr. E.
Belmont, which is called the said Thomas' farm, and in the said tract and
in the possession of his daughter Elizabeth Thomas and relatives, among whom the
said Thomas' property in the Land of Shady, Belmont and all other
parts of the said Stoner's land, property, consisting of two houses, four
heads of cattle, large household and kitchen furniture, farming
utensils, riding vehicles and the like, the same may be found in the farm
on which the said Thomas resides, In witness to whom the payment of
a sum, the sum of \$1000, to him for \$600.00 and two hundred and fifty dollars
John E. Briggs, one for \$500.00 and the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars
and whatever balance may be due the Estate of John E. Briggs
by the said Thomas' hands, witnesses the said Stoner, date about
one fully paid, and the sum for which said tomb was erected
