Know all men by these presents, that I Henry E. Taylor, of Southampton County Virginia,
do hereby declare that it is my intention to claim my Premises, consisting under
the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled to the end
of presents in other Virginia acts to other Constitution of Homesteads in case
of a family, that I do appear, and do hereby of Homestead, in presents property
for the benefit of myself (or myself) and family, exempt from sale for
debts, approved June 7th A.D. 1840, and the said Henry E. Taylor, claiming
as such Homestead, in addition to the articles exempted from Levy or
distress, for the day, in the day, the present Constitution came into effect, to
be such exempt from Levy, Virginia, guaranteeing as before, the following property
to wit, One hundred and Eighty acres of Land, including the building
thereon, by me and family, and Homestead as follows, to the extent
by the lands of Miss Fannie and Maggie Reynolds, on the East by the
lands of Miss Elizabeth Walker, on the West by the lands of Miss Mary
Downs, and on the West by the lands of Miss Mary Bailey, valued by
me at the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, in testimony whereof, the
Said Henry E. Taylor, has set his hands and seal this 14th day of
February A.D. 1841.
