Know all men by these presents, that I Nancy E Taylor, of Southampton County Virginia,
 do hereby declare that it is my intention to claim my Homestead exemption under
 the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled to the
 purpose in these presents and to the Constitution of Homestead in and
 of a family, that I do reside and hold a Homestead in premises proper
 for the family of myself (or myself) and family, except from date for
 date of the said Act of the A.D. 1870, and the said Nancy E Taylor, claiming
 as such Homestead, in addition to the articles therein from Land or
 dwelling, for the day, on the day the present Constitution came into effect, to
 be held exempt from Sale, Virginia, guaranteeing as above, the following paper:
 To wit, One hundred and Eighty seven of Land, including the building
 and Outbuildings by me and family, and Homestead as follows, to the extent
