 McCluney (Togolus) as aforesaid, to be his act and deed and admitted
 to record & change of the said Deed of the State of the amount of
 John Selous and fifty Cents, being affixed thereto and duly considered

This Deed made this 10th day of October 1810, between William H. Lawrence
 and John H. Lawrence the sons of the late said, and James Langford of the late said,
 all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do hereby certify, that the said William
 H. Lawrence, with child H. his wife, in Consideration of the sum of Ten
 Hundred Dollars, have granted, conveyed and sold, and do hereby grant,
 convey and sell, unto the said James Langford, a certain piece or
 parcel of Land containing by estimation about twenty Acres or less,
 and bounded as follows, to-wit: beginning at a Maple or Maple?
 corner line on the side of a Wooded lot on the State side of
 Anthony River fifty feet from said side track, thence to an Oak,
 thence keeping fifty feet from said River bearing up to another
 Oak, thence to a Spruce; thence to a Spruce; thence to a black gum,
 thence to a black gum; thence keeping the said distance up
 the River to a small Spruce; thence along a line of Marked
 trees to a white Oak; then the said Land; thence along a
 line of Marked trees to a white Oak on the side of a hill;
 thence keeping the same distance from the River, to a pine
 Oak, thence bearing about East to a small persimmon; thence
 through the Oak fields to a persimmon, (a bottom) thence
 bearing West along a line of Marked trees to a Spruce.
 from standing on the side of said River just below the ferry;
 thence to the channel of the said River; thence down the
 River to the first station; it being the said piece or parcel
 of Land which was conveyed by John Selous to the
 Southampton County Court on the 20th July 1810; to have and
 to hold the aforesaid piece or parcel of Land with all its
 privileges and appurtenances in any way whatsoever belonging
