

The Duke of Bergues and wife from Wm. Scott as wife to George E.
Bentley & wife to Edward Bentley, was this day executed, and together with
the Consipiracy their amnesties, admitted to receive stamps of the late Dr.
of the Well to the amount of £1000, being affr'd. Bentley and
duly cancell'd.

This Duke made his first day of April in the year in which eight hundred and
sixty two, between Seven Hills and Bergues his wife, (See Order) of the first field,
and John et al. of the other parts, he kept, that the Duke himself had, and
about 300 acres more his day granted to himself to the Duke, and
had back a part of Land which granted to the Duke himself by William de
Rochefort, living in Northampton County, and Hampshire County, happened to be granted
fifteen years ago, 2000 or less, and bounded by the land of the Duke, William
de Ropelle, with general boundaries, and the Duke himself as wife to further
limits, Bergues and all to the Duke's estate, his say 1500 acres of which
property of granted and Conveyed for and in consideration of the Duke (of Berg)
having nothing, the receipt of which Duke now is hereby acknowledged by
