

James L. Westbrook shall deposit this bill in the said Court House before the next term of said Court for the benefit and use of all the children of the said Westbrook and his wife, along with the said bill of their former marriage, so far as the said bill allows the age of twenty two years, should any or either of them die before that age, to be divided equally between them, and after the further time that the said James L. Westbrook shall be permitted to remain on and occupy the said Plantation he being as he may live, and upon the further time that the said Estate shall after the death of said James L. Westbrook, and James L. Westbrook's Curcy and transfer to the children of the said party by their former marriage, in the surviving of them, the share of said James Curcy in the said Estate shall the said James L. Westbrook Curcy, and the said said Estate that he died a minor and deposit the bill in the said Court House for the benefit of his wife and children, giving the claim of himself and all other persons whomsoever.
