The said Davis, made this County Court day, of June in the year one thousand eight hundred
and thirty one, before me, James R. Tyler, Justice, & William Mayo and Louis J. Hayes, clerks, his
Joseph H. Bostwick and James J. Darden of the first part, and Benjamin E. T., of the
other part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, witnesses, as follows;
Whereas John W. Steele deceased died by his last will and Testament recorded in
the Clerk's Office of the County Court of said County on the 1st day of June A.D.
1861, gave and bequeath to the said Davis, as certain tract of land, to be held
by her during her natural life, remainder to go to the said E. C. Mayo,
and whereas the said Davis, Steele and E. C. Mayo did by a Deed of Lease,
and did lease a portion of the said tract of land to the said Darden, during
