R. H. Lynde, Westfield, that the said James F. Whittlesey left great sums
in his bank at Albany the following property to wit, one thousand dollars
of which were in a certain white Cedar House, which is made
between my father Carter Whittlesey and myself, all my father's goods
also all my interest in the property growing out of him, feeding, hay,
crops, pasture, &c. also my family by my birth father and
myself is equal proportioning. In view to secure Whittlesey
from becoming my step or heritage whatever as my heir in a certain
recognition made in before hand of Augt 1, Justice for the peace
for Hampden County on the 15th day of Augt 1871, considered
for my present appearance before the County Court of Hampden County
on the first day of the year then last to witness the acknowledgment
for and concerning a certain sum of money the said James F. Whittlesey

May to William M. Hill, a certain tract of land lying near San
Glen, in the County of Franklin, New Hampshire, containing by survey
forty four acres, more or less, and adjoining the land of James and
William F. Hill, Esq. of the State of New Hampshire, Solomon Fisher and
the said Harry, sold by the estate of A. B. Whittlesey died
