warrant, to Edwards the aforementioned property both personal and real is
granted in fee tail to secure the following debt, the sum of one hundred
dollars due by back Edwards Parker to John C. Parker dated Dec 1851
1851, and due has been after date with interest from date and for which
amount the said Parker does his hereby give to Edwards the sum of
the hundred dollars. The above grant to Edwards on the following condition
that the said Parker shall have the right to take the timber on said
woods of land or hereto above excepted without damage?
