 admitted to record, & being of the substance of the said Deed, to the amount of
 five hundred and fifty acres, and duly Conveyed.

 Know all men by these presents, that I John W. Taylor of the County of Albemarle
 Virginia & North Carolina as heir of a father, do declare & make known to all whom it
 may concern, that I claim a Homestead and property except from my heirs, my wife and
 an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, presenting in that manner an order
 which Certificate of Homestead in favor of a family, whose lot upon a tract of
 Homestead & personal property for the benefit of himself and family except from my
 heirs and his for debts, appointed January 27th 1794, the following real and per-
 sonal property, to wit, a tract of land containing 320 acres, more or less, the
 land on which I reside, value in my hands and my debtors, two horses
 value in gold, three head of Cattle value in gold, and other personal estate
 of my value in gold, and increase, so that value in gold, and other increase,
 and household and kitchen furniture value in gold, the aggregate value of
 said property being \$1000. I claim hundred and eighty dollars

 Homestead & personal property for the benefit of himself and family except from my
 heirs and his for debts, appointed June 27th 1794, the following real estate, to wit, one tract of land value in
 my hands and debts, \$1000, and all my personal property value in two
 hundred dollars, the value of said the said land and personal property
 being \$1000, and being ten thousand dollars, but value in gold
