

This Indenture made, this 22nd day of January, in the year of our Lord two thousand eight hundred and twenty, between Nicholas J. Battle and wife, of the County of Southampton, in State of Virginia, of the first part, and Henry Chamblee of the County of Loudoun, of the second part, witnesses, that the said Nicholas J. Battle and wife have in full consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars, to them in hand paid, by the said Henry Chamblee, as and upon the signing and delivery of these presents, the receipt thereof a hereby acknowledged, they granted, bargained, sold, released and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, release, convey and deliver unto the said Henry Chamblee, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, forever, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the said County of Southampton, and State aforesaid, more especially bounded and described as follows, Beginning at a small stone cross at the head of deep branch, thence down the end of said branch to a large Oak on the edge of the high land at Long Bottom Run, a line corner to N. J. Battle, thence said James J. Battle line S. 80° W. 14 poles to a large white Oak, thence S. 41° W. 14 poles, thence S. 41° W. 14 poles to a white Oak, thence S. 17° W. 23 poles, thence S. 90° W. 14 poles, thence S. 55° W. 6 poles to a pine, thence S. 24° W. 8 poles to the first black containing being (say) any, more or less, to have and to hold said land unto the said together with all houses, crops, dower, and other things, profits, Commodities or privileges thereto in anywise, or any way appertaining, unto him the said Henry Chamblee, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, and the said Nicholas J. Battle and wife have by these presents thence have, released, conveyed, administered and assigned, by these presents forever, Committed and agree to and with said Henry Chamblee, his heirs, executors, Administrators and assigns to accept and forever defend, the said William tract or parcel of land aforesaid, unto it and singular, the premises with every part and parcel thereof, for and clear of and from the claims or demands of any person or persons whatsoever.
