Whereas, the said Thomas J. Ingers and wife allege the wife, for and in her
redemption of the share of the said Henry Schenck, and family, dwelling, the same in their
part, by the said Henry Schenck, at or before the beginning of dealing of
these persons, the same, as well as family, acknowledged, and granted, bargain, sold, released,
and conveyed, with the said Henry Schenck, his heirs, executors, administrators,
heirs and assigns, forever, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying and
being in the said County of Southampton, and State of Virginia, and upon
the same, and described as follows, beginning at a stone fence corner for
J. D. Thomas, in the State line, thence along the State line due East 200
feet, to a pine corner for A. J. Webb, thence at S. 88° 22' 00" E. 100 feet, to a
pine corner, thence for Henry Schenck, thence along a line of Mark
Long, of the County of Southampton, to the Center of the Southampton
River, thence along said River S. 83° 15' 00" E. 53 1/2 feet, thence along a
line of Henry Mark Long, at 39° 03' 00" E. 100 feet, to a large pine at a
place, thence at 32° 15' 00" E. 9 1/2 feet to the first station (containing by
Henry J. Ingers and family about 300) more, to have and
