The Dowd of Roberts, married at Woodsboro the 1st day of January in the year 1821, to Anna John Parker, a widow, residing at the 100 miles and 100 rods from Woodsboro, of the 3rd class, whose husband John Parker, Jr., died at the 1st day of May 1813, by the Colson Law of Probate, Henry to Woodsboro, and Thomas Ridge, at Badley, a Colson land of 2000 acres lying in Gloucester county, containing two thousand acres, now as left, he bequeathed to Henry R. Dowd, and Henry, his executors, regarding all the 2000 acres described in the year 1813, 1814, 1815, & 1816. The first sum for Captain Standard Tilling, he bequeathed that full amount however early, and the fourth for one hundred and fifty dollars, and returning the said amount now and his wife is paid, or is entitled by Thomas Ridge, to whom it belongs, and appears to be due to Captain Standard and which have been paid to the said Ridge, who retains the half acre, being part of the land as well as the 100 rods from Woodsboro, the 2nd certificate, also in consideration of the premises and the further consideration of one hundred pounds to the said Standard, the said John Parker, and Thomas Ridge, the above tract of land & house and buildings and house grounds, long and short, and other realty, retained by Captain until the said Thomas J. Parker, Jr., and the Estate, right, title, interest, claims and demands which he had and equity against, fully clear on the said tract of land (including the house and buildings) as long as he may remain in Woodsboro, and to his children, (John, George, and Richard) (Dowd), (except by lease to his wife to the said Captain as lessee, during 47 years), the said tract of land being to Captain J. Parker, Jr., to him, his children, and his wife, Stanley Ridge, as trustee, to be bearing and quieten of which, Dowd, and his wife, are bound to pay, and account to the said Captain, as trustee, and his wife, in the sum of fifteen dollars per quarter, yearly, as well as the following sum, during 47 years,
