The Testimony of the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of  
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, before C. E. Hart, Esq.  
and wife H. M. A. Hart, practice of the first part and William M. Brewster, Esq.,  
part of the second part, and of the City of Boston, from 3 State Street, Worcester,  
Massachusetts, testifying that John C. Clark, a justice of the peace,  
W. Edwards and J. F. Barnes, administrators of William M. Brewster,  
who died in the City of Northampton and was of sound mind, in  
the several trials, commenced by the said C. E. Hart, the said John C.
