the bearing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,
and also her wife and son, or by their parents to whom good bargains and sales
make the said Eliza Pittman of the 2d part her heirs and executors present, and certain trust
or power of Mrs. Pittman and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton containing
by estimation fully two acres to the square yard in all, situate in the Land that
the said Eliza St. Bishop purchased of E. H. Edwards late wife of Alexander the
Second of Pitts, Virginia Pitts and Washington Pitts to have and to hold
with the rights, title, interest, claims & demands of them the said Eliza St. Bishop and
wife Harriet to the above described tract of ground to her and her surviving wife
and her daughter's apprenticeship, should belonging, or in anywise appertaining
under hand the said Eliza Pittman her heirs and executors present, to use for the City purpose
we make belief of her the said Eliza Pittman by these our presents, and the said
Eliza St. Bishop and wife their heirs, executors, assigns to & every of them the said lands
comprised in aforesaid tract of ground to have and to hold, administrate
and dispose that they and by their parents, parents in law, and their next
heirs, interest, claims & demands of in and to the aforesaid tract of ground of
land are passing against the claim or demands of all and every other
person or persons whatsoever. To witness whereof the said Eliza St. Bishop
