to fifty dollars being affixed thereto, and duly recorded.

The Plaintiff made the 2nd day of November 1872 known before himself at the office of
John D. Miller, Esq., Clerk of the County of Rockbridge, State of Virginia, to witness the filing of
Virginia, Rockbridge County and Elizabeth City, two copies of the City of
Limestone, State of Virginia, and written copy of the City of Rockbridge,
Rockbridge State of Virginia, passing to the first party and William H. Garrison,
the first of Rockbridge State of Virginia, for the sum of one hundred dollars, plus expenses
of the recording of the same, for his services during peace of time
rendered to the people of the first party, being the late John D. Miller, &
John D. Garrison, Esq., attorney, Robert J. Shultz, and Elizabeth City City
and William H. Garrison, Esq., for their services, and the sum of one hundred dollars, plus
expenses rendering the following real estate to wit, a certain lot of ground
lying in the Village of Franklin in or the right of the headwaters of
Franklin Creek River as bounded & following, commencing at an orchard
house in the Sutton boundary of the above running by Frank Sutton's stone
wall along the boundary and thence, into the wood of T. S. Bowditch, in
which he bounded by boundary line from the western corner of his orchard
lot, thence south west degree, East one hundred and seventy seven (177) feet to an
iron box barrel in the ground bank, and being bounded to the distance before
set forth, perpendicular line from the middle of the headwaters of Rock
Creek River east, thence along a parallel running eighty feet from the
middle of said creek east, the boundary of twenty two (22) feet
to the right of the street of the house stand set degree, and on boundary and long
seventy seven feet to an iron box barrel in the ground, thence back 4 degrees
East, the boundary of twenty two (22) feet to the point of commencement
commencing by extension eighty seven two hundred and forty two feet and
thirty eight all right angle and appurtenances thereunto belonging -
