This Indenture made this 26th day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and
seventy two between Charles L. Selig and Margaret C. Selig of the County of Westchester,

second part. Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of
the sum of ten thousand Dollars lawfully received by the said Charles L. Selig and
Margaret C. Selig, have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant
and convey to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever and the
Circumstances or parcels of land situated and being in the County of Westchester,
and which is known and described as follows, (Containing by estimation ten hundred and
be it the same more or less, and bounded as follows, Commencing at a point on the line
of the said Westchester County, running West to the North side of the said street the
East end of Manhattan to a Point on the River bearing from North 30th degrees to North
North West forty, eleven four tenths degrees running West a straight line of twenty two
a distance two c. seven on the line of Charles Johnson and further bounded as follows,
by the line of Joseph Bussard, James of Harris, Charles D. Richardson to North to
Westward to Charles Edwards, James Smith on the line of Richard D. Edwards
to the first of said, by other quit all and excepted the boundaries hereunto
made and appertaining thence North Westward and all the lands here and adjoining of
the said parties of the first part, and the said Charles L. Selig and Margaret C. Selig
have sold and conveyed to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever
and to the heirs of the said party of the second part, by the same part has been an assign
that in the knowledge and delivery thereof he is the lawful owner of the premises
above granted and conveyed, that he is for himself, his heirs and assigns and
persons before him has above granted premises in the quiet and peaceful possession
of the said party of the second part against us and all persons whomsoever lawfully
claiming the same from under or through or under this day or date above expressed
