This I have made the 1st day of July 1831, before me, Justice of the County of Franklin, State of Virginia, of the first part of Samuel B. Barber, of the same county, and John Brown, of the County of the second part, who came and said that he, Edward, and said John B. Barber, had in full of and for the sum of Sixty Dollars, now lawfully due, property in the Village of Franklin, on said Ward 2nd of said city, to the young son of said John, paid the amount in the aggregate of the several four hundred dollars, said amount to be two or four hundred dollars of said property, and further improvements thereon, through the said Justice B. Barber, and said wife, and caused accordingly that the said Samuel B. Barber, and wife, and property, to wit, a certain parcel or tract of Land lying in the approved County of Northampton, and situated as follows, to wit, the whole of the lands of Newbury, Langdon, on the East of the lands of H. F. Coffey, John A. Lippard, Joseph Rogers, George & Mary, of Brunswick, and on the West of the lands of Oliver & Nathaniel, known as the Eastern tract, and of the heirs of said Joseph Rogers, and on the West of the lands of John B. Langdon, Nathaniel Brunswick, John Williams, and H. R. Coffey, was containing by estimation Ten Acres, more or less, said land being in the County of Brunswick, the following debts to wit, the above mentioned purchase money for the in Franklin, said land to be spent in purchase and improvement of land; said debt due as follows, the wife of said Samuel and fifty dollars, made the 22nd day of March 1829, and two hundred and ten dollars after date and payable to Messrs J.
