This Deed made the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy  
witnessed by me, the said Edward E. Hartley, attorney in fact for Henry P. Hartley of the County of Southampton in the State  
of Virginia, of his own freehold, and absolute title of the other party. Whereas it is that in consideration of  
the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars the said Edward E. Hartley aforesaid, of his freehold grant, and good  
conscience, unto the said Alexander Carter and to his heirs and assigns forever, the following real estate, to wit.  
A certain lot or parcel of land in the County of Southampton lying near Hartney Street on the seaboard and  
fronting a road and adjoining the Hartney Mill tract and bounded at front - commencing at the head of the said  
Mill road and running in a Southerly direction along eastern boundary of the Hartney Mill tract thirteen hundred  
and fifty feet, thence in an easterly direction one hundred and thirty five feet, making a Southern boundary at right  
angles with the before mentioned boundary, to the Stony Creek, thence in a westerly direction thirteen hundred and fifty feet  
making an eastern boundary of a part of the Stony Creek to the head of said Mill road, thence in a westerly direction  
one hundred and thirty five feet, along the line of said road to a point of commencement containing by estimation four
