Contract, made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1872, between J. H. Brothman, President of the first party, and the Atlantic and  
Mississippi and Other Rail Roads Company of the second party, Winchester - That the said Parties and  
Henry A. Brothman for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars (1000), money of the United  
States, paid and to be paid at designated account and acknowledge, have executed and completed and do  
by these presents, assignable to the said parties, Mississippi and Other Rail Roads Company, to  
Winchester and assignable and otherwise under standing upon him, the said Brothman having and being  
in the County of Southampton and generally designated as the "South Eastern" road, each of the Parties agrees  
and the Road leading from Socates Bridge Roads by the ground of P. H. Tolson to Petersburg,  
making a certain old field the center of land thereby laid out herein, over the same being  
clearly defined by described title, upon the following and conditions to wch

I. That the timber around the said land, now standing, be cut down and removed during the period and  
which the contracts is made to stand, measured timber (C) inches in diameter at a point, one foot from the  
ground.

II. That the said lands for cutting the timber around the said land, extend over a period of eight (8) years  
from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1873, during which period and for the purpose of cutting, laying and  
removing said timber, the said Railroad Company, its Servt's or agents, by its agents, to lay out the right  
and privilege mentioned and the same is hereby expressly granted, a right and privilege of cutting, laying  
and removing the aforesaid of establishing such iron mills, such places of iron and steel works, and of carrying such  
works and continuing such large or other works, or of laying such roads and of erecting buildings, or such  
land not now used to travel and at such place as the said Company may find necessary and to the full  
rights of the property and privilege purchased and granted by the said Company shall have in  
common cause to sell any building or other property which is now land would be suitable for

granted.

III. That for and consideration of the timber and privilege mentioned in the foregoing Article of the  
contracts, the said Atlantic Telegraph and Other Rail Roads Company has and doth pay to the said Parties and  
amount above (\$1000) in cash and delivered to hand to one of the hands of either hundred dollars (\$100)  
payable on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1872, who weighs, although cash notes, at hundred and eighteen  
pounds the signature of the respective parties to the contracts, - all the day and of  
funds above written.
