Contracts made the 31st day of May 1872, between Benjamin Jones of the County of Southampton, State
and Geo. J. Bennett of Virginia and Comly & Dow his wife of the first part, and the Atlantic, Mississippi and Ohio Rail
Road Company of the second party, Witnesseth, That the said Dow and Comly & the wife of a man and minor
Dow 14th 1858, in consideration of the sum of eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000), currency of the United States, paid and to be paid
at maturity, agreed and acknowledge, that Comly & Dow and Dow, wife, etc., by their joint and several
acts and coming to the said Atlantic, Mississippi and Ohio Railroad Company, thereunto and aforesaid, are and
intend to pay the said Comly & Dow, the sum of \$18,000, and to pay in the County of Southampton and generally designated at the Period, Comly & Dow's tract, together with all such timber
standing on or about Comly & Dow's tract, Wm. W. Morris' quarter and the Davis' Settlement tract, upon the following
time and conditions, etc.

I. That the timber allowed for cutting the timber known as the tract of eight (8) acres front
the 18th day of January 1872, during which period and for the purpose of cutting, laying and removing such
timber, the said Atlantic, Mississippi and Ohio Railroad Company, thereunto and aforesaid, is to enjoy the right and privilege annex
thereto, and the said timber is hereby expressly, granted & conveyed as wholly and fully owned by the consideration aforesaid
of establishing such saw mills as said place front land to time, and of cutting such trees and constructing such
log or other works, and of digging wells and of erecting buildings, as shall be need and of said time to time and such
as placed at the said place of time, and finding, setting up and to the full enjoyment of the property and
privileges aforesaid, and of such works who said company shall have the right to remove or take any timber
in the property which it may have erected or established upon the lands aforesaid.

II. That the said timber is to be cut, setting up and to the full enjoyment of the property and
privileges aforesaid, and of such works who said company shall have the right to remove or take any timber
