and the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged. Now therefore the said Richard A. Rice certifies that, in consideration
of payment to him William D. Shands will stand with Richard A. Rice as co-trustee of land lying
in Southampton County containing 400 estimated acres and twenty two west the said land and
1000 by the tract and 200 acre and adjoining the lands of which the negro estate by C. Holland & Co.
and W. D. Brantly and the said William D. Shands will answer and defend unto the said Richard A.
Rice such title as is vested in him by the assignments of the Negroes in Southampton from the said
Court of the eastern division of the United States Court in Virginia and will make and cause to be given the following
agreement and declaration:
