 what the said people Whitfield and Harriet C. this day gave and in full  
 satisfaction of the sum of Fifty dollars to them in hand paid by the  
 said spirit Margaret, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, that  
 granted, to be paid of the said sum of Fifty dollars to the said Margaret in  
 full, then when the said spirit Margaret and her heirs during the  
 life time of said Harriet C. Whitfield and the right of survivor  
 which she legally possesses in the whole or part of of said spirit  
 said Harriet C. and being in the possession of the County of Mendocino  
 of which she former husband, William C. Whitfield was prior paper  
 and the said people Whitfield and Harriet C. Whitfield this  
 day for themselves their heirs &c. do hereby Covenant and agree with  
 the said spirit Margaret her heirs &c. that they will give of the same  
 present and demand and defend the said sum of Fifty dollars against the  
 claims or demands of all other persons during the natural  
 life of said Harriet C. Whitfield. So we give whereby they have  
 made this their hand and affixed their seals the day  
 and year first above written.
