

That Indenture made this twentieth day of November in the year 1872 between James
 H. Conitt of Southampton County of the first part, J. D. Ridley trustee for Poley Gray and
 children of the second part, Witnesseth that the said James H. Conitt in consideration of the sum
 of fifty dollars to be in hand paid by the said trustee or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof she do hereby acknowledge and do hereby acquit and forever discharge the said J. D. Ridley
 trustee for the benefit of Poley Gray and his heirs and assigns the said James H. Conitt for these presents and
 grantees his heirs, heirs, assigns, executors and assigns and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and
 convey release and confirm unto the said J. D. Ridley trustee for Poley Gray her heirs and assigns forever
 certain tract of lands known as the old Mt. E. Rockwell's Land lying and being in Southwestern County
 and containing 4 1/2 acres. Bounded as follows beginning at a Black gum in N.W. Corner has thence along
 south line east to the River; thence up said River to a black tree known as C. Remond's and
 said land up the river course of the bank to the beginning above unless whereof I have known set
 here and read this 20th day of November in the year 1872.
