irrevocably conveys and transfers all and her said W<sup>t</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Beaton and Mary P. Herley,  
that the said Mary P. Herley shall not during the continuance of her lease place any other building  
on the said premises beyond those following, to wit: stone two miles from the neighborhood of Shingel or  
stone timber, stone, for shacks, office, hotel, house, stable, house for caretakers, and house to keep  
quarters of laborers employed, and it is further stipulated and agreed that the said Mary P.  
Herley shall keep no horses, or stock or sale of goods except spirits by the retail, during the  
said term of her lease, and that on any transfer or assignment of the lease to another that the  
assignee shall take the same subject to all the requirements, stipulations and provisions of this lease,  
and it is further stipulated and agreed that at the expiration of the lease held by the said Mary P.  
Herley shall have the right to remove such of the buildings constructed on the said land as he

John H. Harrison of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, in consideration of the sum  
of One thousand dollars to me in hand paid by W<sup>t</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Beaton of the County of Southampton  
and State of Virginia, the receipt whereof I hereby fully acknowledge, and grantee I assign and  
settle, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and convey unto the said W<sup>t</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Beaton the tract  
of land, or which I now reside containing six hundred and fifty acres more or less, and bounded by  
the lands of Henry Kindred, the Great Oak and McIlvane Hill, and the said land and  
small marsh, being four feet deep, and grub land four feet deep, about three acres, and twenty two pigs,  
four acres and three fourths of an acre, the buggy and harness, the stable, the feed store, the stable, feeder,  
one hundred and forty bushels of farming implements, &c., &c., to him and to his heirs, and to hold the same W<sup>t</sup> M<sup>r</sup>  
Beaton his heirs, assigns, executors and administrators forever, free and discharge of any and all  
incumbrances whatsoever, and I do warrant and defend the title of the property hereby conveyed
