

Moved by a Deed of Trust of date Dec 22, 1871, and duly recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, the same day & year, of said said Maria C. Norrell, late coming to said B. B. Norrell, a trust of land situated in Southampton County, containing three hundred and fifty acres, by the said same in life, granted by the hands of Samuel S. Bushman, James H. Bushman and others, in trust to secure or bonds and to R. P. Spill for seven hundred and fifty dollars, and whereas the said bond with all interest, and costs have been fully paid, and said said Maria C. Norrell is now entitled to a conveyance of the said real estate, and discharged from the trust created by the aforesaid Deed of Trust, we therefore the Deed of Release made the 17th day of January, 1875, before J. B. Smith, Justice of the Peace, of the said County, and also said Maria C. Norrell of the said part, Witnesseth, that in consideration of the above premises, the said said B. B. Norrell, with duly released, & convey the above described tract of land to the said Maria C. Norrell, to her heirs, heirs forever, with special Warranty, free & discharged from the trust created by the aforesaid deed of trust. Witness the following signature and seal.

That Deed made the 17th day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy three, between Maria C. Norrell of the first part and Samuel H. Williams of the other part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witnesseth: That the said Maria C. Norrell, for and in consideration of the sum of sixteen hundred dollars (\$1600.00 or thereabouts) by the said Williams to the said Norrell this day paid, the receipt of which said bond is hereby acknowledged, did grant and convey to the said Williams with general warranty, all that tract or parcel of land lying in said County, on the East side of Rappahannock, supposed to contain three hundred and fifty acres more or less, and bounded by the hands of Samuel S. Bushman, James H. Bushman and others, which said tract is the same that was granted and conveyed to the said Norrell by Richard Edwards by Deed recorded in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of said County, on the 22nd day of December A.D. 1871, referred to which said Deed, it is hereby stated. The tract of land hereby granted & conveyed, being the same of which William C. Norrell did die seized and possessed, and on which he resided at the time of his death. And it is expressly stipulated and agreed by the parties thereto that the above grant, or the said tract of land (that it is to say one fourth of an acre) is expressly reserved by and returned to the said grantor, the said Norrell, together with the undivided right of way thereto and therefrom.
