This Indenture made the 15th day of July in the year of our Lord 1871. between R. J. Nelly and Elizabeth A. his wife, John P. Nelly Jr. and Elizabeth his wife and their heirs, of the first part and John P. Nelly, William Cammell & John D. Cuthbert Trustees for the Baptist Church of the second part. Sheweth that the said R. J. Nelly and Elizabeth A. his wife John P. Nelly Jr. and Elizabeth his wife and their heirs of the first part being desirous to assist in the erection of a house of worship for the Baptist Congregation in the town of Franklin Southampton County, State of Virginia and without the said parties of the first part doing desired to provide against any future controversy that there be integrity with the said enjoyment or possession of such house of worship. They therefore the said R. J. Nelly, Elizabeth A. his wife John P. Nelly Jr. and Elizabeth his wife and their heirs in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to them be here paid by the parties of the second part at or before the said church is hereby acknowledged hath granted sold conveyed and conveyed for the purpose of building a Baptist Church and ground adjoining with the said John P. Nelly, William Cammell & John D. Cuthbert Trustees, their heirs and assigns of the same part all that certain lot or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the town of Franklin County of Southampton and State of Virginia to wit: Beginning at the Eastern intersection of Main Street and James Street and running thence East one hundred and thirty feet and thence South one hundred and fifty feet and thence West one hundred and thirty feet to Main Street and thence North along Main Street to the point of beginning together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining thence to have and to hold the same for use and purpose of the Baptist Church of Franklin County, Virginia and the same shall revert back to the grantors if a church is not built.
