We record the Legislature of Virginia did by an act approved the 27<sup>th</sup> of January 1870 providing in what manner and on what conditions a Slaveholder or head of family shall set forth and hold a household and fixtures & property for the benefit of himself and family except food, clothes, bedding, which is to be committed to the full benefit of a Household except food, clothes, bedding, garnishing or sale. The said Household or head of family shall deliver the sum of the property he set aside as Debt duly secured, to the Master of the Poor, who will then take the sum of Southampton County & Newmarket and Town of or family as set apart as a Household the following property to set the family living ground sufficient containing no quarter of acre in the brickwork of the County value one dollar and money in hand of Dr. B. Price estimated at one hundred dollars. The fine value at one hundred dollars and half a value at ten dollars and eight cents below the said value at five dollars, fine for one acre land and money for the same value at one hundred and twenty five dollars, the said fine value at five dollars, fine for one acre land value at twenty dollars. The fine value at one hundred dollars, fine one value at one hundred, fine one value at thirty dollars, kitchen furniture value at ten dollars, fine two value at five dollars. Fine fine value at five dollars. Fine bed value at five dollars, fine carriage value at five dollars and carriage value at five dollars. One spinne value at one dollar. One six value of dollars.

The said personal and real estate to be held by me as a beneficent under the above mentioned, at witness my hand and seal this 25<sup>th</sup> of January 1873.
