Moved by a third of the Circuit Court of Sevier County, in the County seat of Cloud and wife vs
Cloud, that it was ordered that S. P. Evans, trustee for wife and children of J. C. Cloud and his wife vs
J. C. Cloud, which was arranged to be by J. C. Cloud one acre by deed duly recorded in the Clerk's office of Sevier County,
and云云 the said S. P. Evans has offered a sale of the said land to E. C. Thomas, and has invited the
plaintiff many times and occasions to inspect the land, or that a plat of equal value \$1000, be claimed for the wife and
children of the said J. C. Cloud, and when asked J. C. Cloud has a debt of about \$1000 to the trust of land, nearly even
of J. C. Cloud's wife children of equal value will bear no account, which he desires to sell, and whereas the said J. C. Cloud
is of opinion that it would be a safe and better investment for the wife and children of the said J. C. Cloud than
the present trustee would be able, and whereas he said J. P. Evans, trustee as aforesaid has agreed to buy the said tract

the sum of one thousand dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said George H. Cloud and wife
S. P. Evans doth grant and convey unto the said J. P. Evans' trustee, and his heirs forever with general warranty, in fee simple
of lands situated in Sevier County, Tennessee, being one acre, to be the same as now or last bounded by the lands of the said
J. C. Cloud, H. C. Jones, and P. C. Glendale, and the said acre is given by George H. Glendale, for the use and benefit
of his son, George H. Glendale, and his heirs forever, who shall hold the said tract of land for the exclusive
use of his wife and children of the said J. C. Cloud, and for one thousand dollars more over and above the said J. C. Cloud,
now intimated upon the further trust that the said J. C. Cloud may at any time require and extract the said
