

At the Court held the 25th day of March 1808 between Anne Morris, plaintiff, party of the first part, & H. H. Bligh, jointly of the second party, and Jonathan Parker, party of the third party, Plaintiff by a bill filed the 17th day of November in the year of 1808 and of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County Court, the said H. H. Bligh in order to secure to the said Jonathan Parker the payment of a certain sum created by the said H. H. Bligh, was payable to the said Jonathan Parker, bearing date on the 17th day of December in the year 1808 and for the payment of the sum of three hundred dollars, did, every man tract to the said Anne Morris certain property situate and described in estate and all of three, & more like No. 13 in the town of Southampton all his heron property and stock in trade, and almost the last but has been fully paid and the said H. H. Bligh doth the said property to be released to him. See therefore this deed witnessed that the said Anne Morris in consideration of the summire, and by and with the consent of said Jonathan Parker through his administrator S. J. Butler to satisfy him by leaving a party to the said, and signing and sealing the same with present and related unto the said H. H. Bligh at that time No. 13 all personal property and stock in trade, the said Jonathan Parker through his administrator S. J. Butler to release to the said H. H. Bligh all he claim upon the said property.

This Deed made the 1st day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty one
between James Mc. Corle and wife Martha A. of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the
one party and Willa C. Pitts of the same County and State of the other party. Whereas that the said
James Mc. Corle and wife Martha A. Pitts are in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and forty
and 25/100 dollars to him in hand paid by the said Willa C. Pitts the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
With greatest thanks and sets and by these presents doth grant, bargains and sell unto him the said
Willa C. Pitts his heirs and assigns forever certain tract or parcel of land and house at the Pitts
Ammsted land situated lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of St. Luke
Containing by a late Survey one hundred and eight and one fourth acre it being part of the tract of land
purchase by the said James Mc. Corle of the heirs of John Lester and bounded as follows to wit
Beginning at a North westerly Stake stone 4.273 12.32 E. to a post in Taylor's branch thence
up said branch to a tree to the east on the Taylor branch tract thence N. 6° W. 5' to a Hemlock
tree 3.36 N. 6° W. 6' to a pine stone 1.360 N. 6° E. 6' to a pine in little swampy
like tract thence down the said little swampy to a Cypress stone 3.12 E. 6.25' thence to a pine stone
3.82 E. 5' to a pine stone 3.83 E. 1' to a pine stone 3.67 E. 12' to a pine stone
3.71 E. 4' to a pine stone 3.43 E. 6.2' 25' E. to a pine stone 3.30 E. 4.25' E.
to Holly's beginning. So have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land and its appurtenances
which belonging unto him the said Willa C. Pitts his heirs and assigns forever and the said James
Mc. Corle and wife Martha A. Pitts doth declare that he has executed and delivered this hereby
deed and agree with the said Willa C. Pitts to his executors, friends and assigns that they will
by these presents warrant and defend all the right and title granted to the aforesaid tract or parcel of land
and its appurtenances against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. In witness
