The Rich Woods were entered into the 22nd day of April in the year of our Lord 1878 before John C. Scott Esq. Justice of the Peace, and I, John D. Little and Louis A. Miller Jr. Settlers of the second quarter of the town of New Kent, do hereby and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and fifty dollars paid to us in hand, pay the receipt whereof is herby acknowledged, to said John C. Scott Esq. and Rose C. Scott their daughter wife of John D. Little and Rose C. Scott and Miller Jr. Settlers a certain tract of land and improvement thereon belonging being in the County of New Kent Virginia near New Kent bounded as follows: Beginning at N.W. corner to a tree between birth of a black goat standing on the east side of old field border land. thence west to a tree N.W. corner in said old field border land. thence along the same N. 26° 14' E. 53 1/2 feet to a black goat standing in a small bomb thence southwards down the bank and along said N.W. corner line of wood lot to the beginning containing thirty two rods and two chains more or less. thence following the same and going to west the said tract of land to be left enclosed and surveyed by Jacob J. Little and Louis A. Miller the morning the next day people being doing their usual best of quiet peaceful, and at the depth of about three feet to be held and engaged by the surface during his life time, and in the death of the survivor Miller Jr. Little and his wife Rose C. Scott and Rose C. Scott their daughter wife of John D. Little and Louis A. Miller Jr. A. H. Little and Miller Jr. Settler the title to the said tract of land forever to entitl the following deposition and seal.
