Brink and West Edwards, and containing one hundred and forty seven acres, subject to one of lots, the said tract of land being the remaining portion of the land that the said Henry G. White purchased of Dr. W. Edwards, the other portion of which said land was sold to the said White G. W. H. Webster; and which said tract contains four hundred and nine acres, witness the following signature and seal:
