With witness that in consideration of the sum of Two hundred & ten dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged, the said parties of the first part do grant and convey to the said Bond and his heirs, issue, with good warranty, a certain parcel of land, situate in Southampton County, embracing by survey, 100 acres bounded by the lands of the said Bond, the lands of J. Briggs and wife, the lands of the said Sumner, all of said land lying on the South west side of the public land leading from St. Andrew Church to Danvers.

And the said Westbrook has agreed to have the following property to wit: In addition to the present prospective debt to have and to the said property not only in relation to the act of assembly of Virginia passed at its late term on the said first of June, 1872 under any statute that this day of May 28th 1873.
