With witness that in consideration of the sum of Two hundred & ten Dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged, the said parties of the first part do grant and convey to the said Powell and his heirs forever with a good warranty, a certain parcel of land, situate in Southampton County, containing by survey 100 acres bounded by the lands of the said Powell, the lands of J. Hedges and with the lands of the said Jennie, all of said land lying on the South West side of the public Road leading from New Church to Drumphin.
