The Deed made the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year 1873, between James Daugherty and Rosemary, his wife of the State of Virginia and County of Franklin of the first part and K. R. Griffiss trustee of said County and State of the second part, Abingdon, that in consideration of the sum of five dollars to them in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said James Daugherty and Rosemary, his wife, do grant, sell and by these presents have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed unto the said K. R. Griffiss, himself, all the right title and interest in and to a certain tract or lot of land, situate in the town of Franklin, State County aforesaid and lying on the north east side of the public road leading from the said town of Franklin to Blackwater river opposite U.S. and commencing at a small clump of trees near the road aforesaid, according to the line described as a tract of Richard Beale's wife to W. S. Boney July 25<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1790, acre, chain 5 69' E. 70' wide, chain 5 79' E. 70' wide, chain 5 69' N. 70' wide, chain 5 19' E. 70' wide to the point of beginning. Contained by description one acre, together with all the improvements thereon and appurtenances belonging thereto, to have and to hold the same of James Daugherty for the following uses and purposes to wit, to remain to payment of one pound annually by the said James Daugherty out of the portion of the first part herein, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1873, for the sum of one hundred dollars and postage on demand to W. S. Boney, with instant delivery at the rate of six per cent. And the said portion of the first part contained that should be said James Daugherty make default and fail to pay the said sum of one hundred dollars, after reasonable notice or demands placed by the said W. S. Boney, his heirs, executors or assigns, then the said K. R. Griffiss trustee, shall after reasonable notice of two days of sale, inform me at public auction the property herein contained free from all liens, taxes or the part of the parties of the first part, having, during the following seven years, sted the day and year above written.
