

Know all men by these presents that I Robert Beaton of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, husband and head of a family do make known and declare by this act under my hand and seal that I do own and hold all or part of the general Assembly of Virginia prescribing the amount in which slaveholders or head of families shall be allowed and held a domestic and personal property for the support of himself and family free and except good Levy, taxes etc. I do also the following precisely to wit: Several parcels of land situated hundred parcels of fields. Five acres all in houseable and kitchen land, consisting of lots & gardens, orchards, Cella church lands, tennis, fields, plots, docks, crops, gardens, vines, jets, yards, walls, areas, also all my house land place &c. And all property belonging to me by will made or other evidence of all my own hands having such as registered with our government not exceeding in amount the sum of two thousand dollars as provided by the Statute aforesaid.

I do also make my hand and seal the 21st day of July 1872.

Myrick Trustees of Public Free Schools in Southampton County of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas that in Consideration of the sum of One dollar (\$1.00) in hand paid to the said Benj. C. Merrill by the said J. C. Merrill, O. White and R. H. Myrick Trustees etc. the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, to grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. C. Merrill, O. White and R. H. Myrick Trustees and their successors in office, a certain tract of Land lying on the aforementioned Summerville in the County of Southampton and containing total acres (1) (for the purpose of erecting thereon a public free colored school house) and bounded by the land of David Penel, B. C. Merrill, David Bell do, and others to have and to hold the same forever. The right and title to said Land I covenant generally, & witness my hand and seal the 22nd day of July A. D. 1872. Wm. J.
