containing the quantity of one acre to be in three rods in depth, and bounded on the West by the road  
from John Williams to William Evans, on the east by a partition line between the said Mr. C.  
Bettis & the land to become known and called "3 corners" as shown in the plan to accompany  
this Deed, the last to return to William Evans, but the building to belong to the  
said Mr. C. Bettis with the privilege of letting the same into the said
