Johnson in the same sum of \$100, and loaned to the said J. James & William Johnson, Long Island and Staten Island, being the former residence where I now reside, together with all the apprenticeship debts belonging, or in any way of property vested in both to have and to hold the same given the 1st of Oct. 1877, from you to me, I hope you'll receive it the 1878, and will then be satisfied, always I have pleasure in my heart and often in my soul this h't day of November, A.D. 1878.

that the said James H. Williams, with great care and pains, has  
written down the following property to us, at Clio in trust as joint
