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This Deed, made the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy three, between James Pittard and settled to him his wife, of the City of Norfolk, in the State of Virginia, of the one part, and Andrew Parker of Southampton County of the other part, witnesseth, That in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and eighty two dollars and fifty cents the said James Pittard and settled to his wife do grant with general warranty, unto the said Andrew Parker and to his heirs and assigns forever, the following real estate to-wit a parcel of land in Southampton County, Virginia containing by survey, forty six and a half acres more or less. Beginning at the South corner, thence along said road S. 27° W. 21. 98 chains, to the Franklin road, thence along said road S. 27° E. 14. 20 chains to a oak tree, thence S. 17° 45' E. 16. 46 chains to a live oak, thence along said ditch S. 17° 45' E. 25. 22 chains to Black Creek, a course for the dredg in old Col. James R. 12. 74 ft. 4. 45 chains to a Black Creek, thence S. 82° 45'. 5. 6. 2 chains to a Black Creek, thence S. 76° 45' W. 3. 5. 0 chain, thence S. 51° 45' E. 14. 15 chain to a white oak bush, thence S. 53° 45' W. 8. 0. 7 chain to South Ferry road at the Beginning, together with all and singular the appurtenances belonging to the same. And the said James Pittard conveys that he has the right to carry the said land to the said grantee, that the said grants shall have full possession of the said land, that he has no cause to murmur the said land, and that he will execute such further appearance of the said land as may be requisite.
